

Lindberg

a typeface by Feòrag NicBhrìde

Lindberg is based on a font used for the recipe names in an early 20th century Latvian vegetarian cookbook. This type lies somewhere in-between blackletter and Art Nouveau styles; the recipes themselves are set in a classic black-letter typeface. The book appears to be a translation from Danish, and Lindberg is the name of the author.

This typeface has over 600 glyphs. As well as all those required to write European languages which use Latin script, Greek and Cyrillic characters are included. If you do not have the appropriate keyboard driver installed, they can be found using the Glyphs/Special Characters menu item in most MacOS X applications.

This archive contains the OTF version of the font, which can be used on Classic MacOS, MacOS X, Linux and Windows. It includes the following files:

- **About Lindberg OTF.pdf** - this file.
- **Lindberg.otf** - the font file In MacOS X, double click on this to see a preview. Click on the “Install Font” button to install. For earlier versions of Mac OS, this file should go in the ‘Fonts’ folder in the System Folder.

A TrueType flavoured OpenType version is also available.
